



D-DAY 80 Portsmouth is the focal point for the UK's D-Day 80 commemorations as the initial landings were controlled from Southwick House on Portsdown Hill, and the amphibious armada rendezvoused south of the Isle of Wiaht en route to France in 1944. The main commemorative events in the city on 5 June are ticketed and 'sold out' very quickly, so the general public's best view of events will be on the live TV broadcast. The traditional commemorative ceremony will be held at the **D-Day Memorial by South** Parade Pier on 6 June, and another commemoration will be held at the National Memorial Arboretum, while a number of major events will be held in Normandy on the same day. **Details of D-Day celebrations** can be found at https://dday80. campaign.gov.uk Portsmouth's Armed Forces Day celebrations follow hard on the heels of D-Day, with the city holding its event on Southsea Common on Saturday 8 June.
