4. ★ Northumbria University Northern Hub – Tri-Service Food Poverty Survey

Lynda Pearson our Welfare and Wellbeing Programme Manager invites Shipmates to read the article below received from Professor Matthew Kiernan

Northumbria University's Northern Hub for Veterans and Military Families Research is carrying out research on food insecurity and financial hardship within the veterans and families community in the UK. There is currently very little research or understanding of the risk of financial hardship, food insecurity and how that is impacted by service attributable injury or illness after retirement within our community.

We will be asking you to participate in a survey so that we can better understand the current situation. All members of the RNA will be asked to take part. The survey will be online, which means that you will receive an email with a link to take part, by using this link your responses will be anonymous unless you wish to be identified and contacted and engage in later research. We understand that for some this might not be ideal, but the cost of paper based surveys has made it impossible for us to send out surveys in this project. The survey will take 5 to 10 minutes to complete and the questions will cover your food situation over the last 30 days as well as some questions on disability and service attributable injuries. If you have received an Armed Forces Compensation Scheme payment or are in receipt of Armed Forces Compensation Scheme regular income, we are very keen to understand that more and will ask you, if possible, to provide the details of your award in the survey. In particular we would ask for the Table Number, Item Number and Level Number given in your award letter.

In light of the current living crisis, the government and the armed forces sector are very keen to better understand the current situation that veterans and their families face, and we would be very grateful if you would consider taking part in this survey. I am proud to announce that Admiral Jellicoe House, our new care home in Portsmouth, is officially open. We held a short ceremony on 20th October led by Nick Jellicoe, naval author and grandson of our founder, which included hoisting the White Ensign by kind permission of the First Sea Lord Admiral Sir Ben Key and cutting the commissioning cake by one of the first residents Andy Burns and the youngest junior rating from HMS COLLINGWOOD's Victory Squadron, AB2(D) Millie Meerloo-Jones.

It was a lovely occasion despite some unhelpful rain showers, marking the culmination of our centenary care home project to offer the highest quality care for veterans in Portsmouth, including those living with dementia. We are hugely proud of our achievements in bringing this project to successful conclusion, despite a pandemic, to time, on budget and most importantly to the highest standard of care that our people deserve.

ROYAL MARINES BAND CONCERT

I had been hoping to be able to report the success of our Royal Marines Band Concert on 11th September - sadly we had to postpone the concert as it fell in the period of national mourning on the passing of Queen Elizabeth II. SUPPORTING OUR PEOPLE

As you would expect we are very busy supporting our people during the current cost of living crisis. On the principle that charity begins at home, the trustees kindly agreed to an additional increase in salary for our lowest paid staff, particularly those working so hard in both care homes.

We are continuing to help those most in need in the naval community. We have made over two thousand awards so far this financial year worth £1.3m, including £59k on rental arrears, £22k on food and £13k on council tax arrears. The worst may be to come; we have been blessed with an unseasonably warm autumn but we worry that if we have a cold winter, many families and individuals may struggle.

After the leaving the service Joe became a Prison Officer and eventually joined the RNA in November 1981. He served as a Branch Welfare Officer, Branch Entertainments Officer and as Branch Vice President (2010). S/m Joe became a Life Member in November 2020.

15. ★ Ton Class Association - HMS Shavington -

Shipmates will be very interested in the article below which was very kindly forwarded by S/m Peter Down, Vice Chairman of the Ton Class Association. I'll let Peter explain.......

The background is as follows: the TON Class Association used to have Affiliations with several villages after which TON vessels had been named, but over time these links have faded away as the principals involved at both village and TCA ends moved away or died. One such affiliation was with the village of Shavington in Cheshire.

Earlier this year Sara Randle, the Community Manager on Shavington Parish Council "rediscovered" the link and suggested that TCA might be represented at their Remembrance Day service. The coincidences continue; Rear Admiral John Lippiett, President of TCA, commanded HMS Shavington in 1974-76 and has sent a note to the Parish Clerk commending the potential revitalisation of the link with TCA.

The story is really one about a series of coincidences, but it underlines the long arm of comradeship in the RN.

Shavington Remembrance

VMT and BZ to David Bridge who represented TCA at the Remembrance Sunday Service in Shavington, near Nantwich, Cheshire on 13 November 2022. *Pictured right*.

The village had been affiliated with TCA in the early 1990's but, as is often the case, the affiliation faded away when the principals on both sides moved away or died.



David had been posted to HMS SHAVINGTON in 1956 during his National Service as an ME1, due to his previous experience as a plumber. At 21 he was the oldest Junior Rate aboard and was known as "Pop"

SHAVINGTON participated in Operation Musketeer, the Suez Canal Campaign in 1956 and six Cyprus patrols up to 1959, plus a deployment to Aden, before being paid off to Reserve in 1969. She was recommissioned in 1974 for service with the Fishery Protection Squadron, being



commanded in 1974-76 by Lt John Lippiett, now Rear Admiral and TCA President. Also in FPS at that time was BRONINGTON commanded by the then Lt Charles, Prince of Wales, who consented to become TCA Patron in 1994.


As well as army representatives and navy, there was also members of Royal Naval Associations in the adjoining areas, and branches of the Royal British Legion. Refreshments were enjoyed

Accepting the picture are (from left to right) former TAG (Telegraphist Air Gunner) Shipmate President Ron Underwood who flew the Swordfish from warships engaged on the Russian Convoys, next to Ron is Shipmate Carol Lee, widow of Sub Lieutenant Edgar Lee who as a 20-year old flew as an Observer on the Channel Dash.

All 6 Swordfish were shot down but Edgar survived along with his pilot who he rescued and saved his life, for that act he was awarded the DSO. On the right is Shipmate Valerie Sayer, widow of Petty Officer TAG Les Sayer. Les is perhaps best



known for being the TAG in the Swordfish that managed to place a torpedo in the German battleship BISMARCK which did enough damage to slow the ship down. To have three Shipmates so closely connected to the Fairy Swordfish in one RNA Branch is unique.

Shipmates may not be aware but......at the outbreak of WWII, the Borough of Reigate adopted HMS Ark Royal.

With close links going all the way back to Lord Howard of Effingham and the first Ark Royal. The ship was a natural choice.

In 1942, Captain Maund presented the Borough with the ship's Ensign and plaque. At the presentation parade held outside the Town Hall was a young Sea Cadet, Bob Pearce.

The Ensign hung, pride of place, for many years in the Council Chambers.

During refurbishments carried out in the 70s, the Ensign was taken down and stored in a "safe place", lost and forgotten. Despite many enquiries from the Reigate Branch over the years, its disappearance became a mystery, then, in 2019 it was discovered in the basement vault of the Town Hall!

It's condition was good considering it's age and the branch commissioned the building of a special frame to safeguard preserve the ensign so that it could be displayed again. Covid struck and plans were shelved.

On Saturday 19th November this year, Reigate RNA along with councillors and other interested parties witnessed the unveiling by the Mayor of Reigate & Banstead, Cllr Frank Kelly at the top of the Ceremonial staircase in the Town Hall where it is now on view for all to see.

The Lord Lt. of Fife Mr. Robert Balfour laid the first wreath on behalf of His Majesty King Charles III and during the laying of the wreaths, our Branch Piper and Honorary Member Brooklyn Morris played the very moving lament.

The parade then reassembled on the road outside the Garden of Remembrance and Parade Commander Alan Browne marched the parade back to the Parish Church, where the Service was conducted by Rev. Colin Alston, with Readings by Lord Lt. Robert Balfour and s/m Dot Patterson. On completion of the service the parade commander fell in the parade for a March Past on the route back to the Civic Centre and the salute was taken by the Lord Lieutenant of Fife Robert Balfour.

Before the parade was dismissed, the Lord Lieutenant gave a few words of praise to the parade attendees and expressed his own words a tribute in remembrance of those who gave their today so that we could see our tomorrow. He then joined us at the Burgh Arms for a tot of pussers rum, a light buffet and cup of hot soup and a cool refreshing beer.

The weather for the day was clear a blue sky and a warm light breeze.

We are now getting ready for our annual Carol Concert which will be held in the Wardroom of MoD Caledonia on the 6th of December.

The branch is also taken on a 'schools project' which is explained in the article below.

Following two long years of Covid-19 lockdown, at last our Branch is getting back to some



semblance of normality. One of the legacies Rosyth Branch promised to deliver, as a condition of funding we received from the Armed Forces Covenant Fund towards our Beacons of Light celebrations in 2018, was a commitment to support our local community and in particular local Primary Schools, by visiting the schools on a regular basis and giving Power Point presentations on the historical importance of Rosyth as a Naval Base.

Rosyth Naval Base evolved as a direct consequence of the arms race between Britain and Germany in 1909. Going forward with our project Norman and Dave will be producing

presentations on other historical Naval installations that were set up in the Kingdom of Fife over

the last hundred years. These will include other WWI and WWII historical Naval Battles, the Role of HMS Tarlair, the strategical role played by Orkney in the War at Sea and the demographic impact on local populations, education and employment, as a direct result of the Navy's strategy to meet the threat from Germany's arms expansion.

Following the passing of our Secretary John Sherwood in March this year, Shipmate Norman Thoroughgood, who partnered John in the pilot project, resumed the presentations with his new assistant to the role, Shipmate Dave Evans.

In November, with the kind permission of the Head teacher of Donibristle PS Mrs. Karyn Rennie and Deputy Head Mrs. Karen Hart, who is our liaison with 6 other Primary Schools, Norman and Dave delivered a total of 9 Power Point Presentations to P7 pupils at Donibristle, Dalgety Bay, Kings Road,



Park Road, St Johns, Inverkeithing and Limekilns Primary Schools. The theme of this presentation was, The Battle of the Atlantic and Associated Actions. Aids created for the presentation included a static display covering, The Atlantic convoys and battles, Capt. 'Johnnie Walker DSM', Wolf-Packs and underwater detection and weaponry. A Static display was also provided which covered HM Ships of WW2 era and those that took part in the Atlantic.

As a bonus S/m Dave Evans provided a pair of German binoculars used by a U-Boat commander from the 2ndworld war. The children were invited to look through them and contemplate who had held them and what they had looked at.

Testimony to their efforts were shown by the enthusiasm of all the pupils who showed a great interest in the subject and a wish to have more presentations in the future. Below is also a letter of commendation from the Deputy Head of Donibristle P.S.

It is based on 12 acres of land and comprises of animals, horticulture and communal building, and offers a range of activities, experiences and support services to improve health, wellbeing and opportunities for all. ARK has been fortunate to have had a successful application to the National Lottery Community Fund to expand and improve access to mental health support services within Somerset.

Chard WATCH CIC

Jon is now working for Chard WATCH CIC which is also a community interest company working with people in the community with mild to moderate mental health issues and social anxiety, so the close working connection is of benefit to both worthy organisations. ARK and WATCH are also excited to be working more closely in the future as they embark, through the funding from The National Lottery Community Fund, on employing two Project Managers who will be focussing on pooling of resources and working with partner agencies providing support to under-

RNA Colchester Branch

RNA Colchester Branch are celebrating their 'Promotion' to City status after the late Queen Elizabeth promoted a number of towns to city (B13 promotion!) in celebration of her Platinum Jubilee. Congratulations Shipmates.

The Romans founded Camulodunum in AD43 when they landed in Britain. Six years later, they created a permanent settlement for Army veterans here, and classified it as a Colonia, the Roman equivalent of modern-day city status. Celtic queen Boudica objected to the Roman occupation of her territory and eventually took over and destroyed large parts of the city. It still, however, proudly boasts of being "Britain's 1st City".





As part of Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee celebrations earlier this year, Colchester's status as a city was reinstated and, at a ceremony on 23 November, the Letters Patent, one of the last documents signed by the late Queen, were presented to the Mayor, Cllr. Tim Young. The ceremony was originally due to take place on 12 September, but had to postponed when other evenst intervened.

Three reasons were cited by the Government for the award, namely the history of Colchester; its continuing military background as a Garrison Town for the last 165 years; and its cultural infrascructure, referring particularly to the award of the Art Fund Museum of the Year 2021 to the *Firstsite* gallery. RNA Colchester branch was honoured to be invited to attend the ceremony and more than 200 people assembled in the Moot Hall to witness the presentation of the Letters Patent by the Lord Lieutenant of Essex, Jennifer Tolhurst. Lord Lt Tolhurst commented on the "modern, vibrant and multi-faceted" nature of the city and drew attention to its military heritage.

The current Garrison Commander Lt.Col. Ed Rankin, symbol of that continuing heritage and a supporter of the campaign, said there was a "real sense of shared pride" at Colchester's newly revived city status. That sentiment was repeated by several speakers on behalf of the Council, notably its leader Cllr. David King and Colchester's High Steward, Sir Bob Russell, who has been a leading campaigner for city status for many years.

The campaign began in earnest when, as part of the Queen's Ruby Jubilee in 1992, a competition was opened for towns in England to apply for city status. Colchester was one of 20 to enter. Further competitions were launched in 2000 as part of the Millenium celebations and in 2002 for the Queen's Golden Jubliee. Colchester voted in 2009 to increase its efforts to achieve the award and *Destination Colchester*, which had been founded to promote and improve the town, was brought onside to help the movement. Thirty years of work has now been rewarded. The presentation ceremony was immediately followed by a resolution, unsurprisingly unanamiously passed, that changed the name of Colchester Borough Council to Colchester City Council.

- a. A motion is submitted in the name of a Branch. Secretaries of proposing and seconding Branches are **certifying** that the motion or amendment reflects the view of the Branch meeting (not a committee); and that voting was conducted in accordance with Rule 20.
- b. A separate form is required for each Motion or Amendment
- c. A manuscript copy is acceptable for additional Motions or Amendments if the printed form is not available.
- d. The Motion or Amendment should be as short and precise as possible avoiding ambiguity. A Motion should normally start with the word `THAT'
- e. The explanation is to assist the scrutiny of the Standing Orders Committee in understanding the intention behind the Motion so that they may be able to consider its presentation so it can be improved and implemented as soon as possible (Conference Bye Law C4)
- f. Motions may be submitted at any time but must reach the General Secretary by 3 February 2023.
- g. Motions of Urgency should reach the General Secretary not less than 48 hours before Conference. (In accordance with Conference Bye Law C6.) and include an explanation about the urgency.
- h. Amendments to Motions should also normally reach the General Secretary not less than 7 days before Conference. The provision for the submission of amendments during Conference is in the Conference Bye-Laws.
- i. Bye-Laws. A Motion to Conference may propose that a Bye-Law be set aside or it may ask the Council to consider making or amending a Bye-Law.
- j. The Branch Proposing a Motion **must** have it Seconded by another Branch before forwarding it to the General Secretary. (Conference Bye Law C3a)

Notes and conditions

- (a) Under Association Rule 11 the Council requires all Branches forming a club to register it and its name with the appropriate authority through RNA headquarters, and thereafter to apply for an Annual Permit
- (b) The application for the Annual Permit should be submitted by the Branch having first received the Area's endorsement, to RNA Headquarters by the 7 December 2022. If either the Branch or the Area cannot approve the application, it should endeavour to resolve the reasons with the Club, but failing this should report full details to the General Secretary with a copy to the Council member for the area.
- RNA Central Office will issue the permit dated 1 January of the following year as soon as (c) practicable.
- If the premises are not owned by the Branch it is a condition that adequate facilities are provided (d) by the owner or lessee for the conduct of Branch business.
- If the Secretary's address for correspondence is not the same as the registered office for the club, (e) this should be shown after their signature
- The conditions specified on the Permit as being accepted by the Club include the following: (f)
 - 1. All members of the Club shall be members of the Association with not less than 20 Full and or Life members as defined by clause 7 of the Royal Charter.

- 2. The Club will, in general, do all possible to further the objects of the Association and will support and encourage the work of the Branch with which it is associated.
- 3. The Club will abide strictly by its registered rules which shall be those approved by The Council and accepted by the Licensing authority. Amendments to the Rules may only be made by the Council; they shall apply to each Club. Clubs are to use the registered Model Rules for the RNA, which ensures that they are always compliant with the Law and RNA Charter.
- 4. Each Club shall review its Bye-Laws annually and submit amendments to the Council for approval.
- 5 Two copies of the audited accounts of the Club shall be forwarded to the General Secretary each year.
- The Council shall be entitled to appoint a representative to inspect all documents, accounts and books of the Club on giving seven days notice.
- 7 The Council and the appropriate Area Committee may from time to time pay a visit of inspection to the Club.
- 8 The Council can give seven days written notice of cancellation of the permit, whereupon the Club shall thereupon cease to trade under the title of the "Royal Naval Association" and to use the RNA registered model Rules.
